Equality & Beauty

So God created humankind in his image. (Genesis 1:27)

While giving the invocation at the presidential inauguration, Rev. Rick Warren referred to the occasion as a “hinge point of history”. For our country to elect a man of African American descent to its highest office says a lot about humanity and our country. Regardless of our political leanings, I believe we can all celebrate that our country is capable of electing someone of African descent to the presidency.

As I understand it, our country was founded on five basic premises. Some of these premises were written, some unwritten; some were noble, some despicable; some were eternal truths, some were terrible lies; some of these premises directly contradicted one another. But all these premises played a large role in shaping our nation.

Premise #1 – All people are created equal.

Premise # 2 – All people deserve to pursue happiness.

Premise #3 – The government should have to answer to its people.

Premise # 4 – Light skinned people are superior to dark skinned people.

Premise #5 – Men are superior to women.

The history of our nation, especially as showcased in the

recent presidential campaigns, including the primaries, is one that teaches us that noble premises of our nation are exponentially more powerful than the despicable premises. Just twenty years ago, young African American males often were taught that they were not even smart enough to play quarterback for the football team. Today, young African American males will grow up with the knowledge that someone who looks like them can rise to highest office in our country. We’ll never know the difference this knowledge will make in the lives of many young people, but we can trust it will be great.

That an African American President can take the oath of office on the steps of a Capital building constructed by African American slaves shows how far we have come. The continued gaps in income and educational opportunity between races and genders show how far we still have to go.

Still, as I consider the power that the truth that all people are created equal has exhibited in shaping our nation’s history and mending its every flaw, it occurs to me that in the Church we have an even greater truth to share with our world when we affirm that all people are created in God’s image. Not only do we believe that all people are equal, we believe all people are beautiful.

Thank you, God, for your truth that sets us free!
