 YOUR EASTER LILIES



You can put a lily on the altar in Honor of or in Memory of a loved one.

The lilies are \$11 each.

Fill out the order form that you will find in the Sunday Worship guide and put it in the offering plate with your check.

We are almost there. We are almost to Holy Week and the Triduum Sacrum—what many Christians hold to be the three most sacred and holy days of the year: from sunset on Maundy Thursday to sunset on Easter Day we celebrate the saving events of Jesus Christ’s suffering, death, and resurrection.

To appreciate why this is so, I share Richard John Neuhaus’ words with you:

By these three days all the world is called to attention. Everything that is and ever was and ever will be, the macro and the micro, the galaxies beyond number and the microbes beyond notice—everything is mysteriously entangled with what happened, with what happens, in these days. This is the “axis mundi”, the center upon which the cosmos turns. In the derelict who cries from the cross is, or so Christians say, the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. The life of all on this day died. Stay a while with that dying.

Every human life, conceived from eternity and destined to eternity, here finds its story truly told. In this killing that some call senseless we are brought to our senses. Here we find out who we most truly are, because here is the One who is what we are called to be. The derelict cries, “Come, follow me.” Follow him there? We recoil. We close our ears. We hurry on to Easter. But we will not know what to do with Easter’s light if we shun the friendship of the darkness that is wisdom’s way to light (Death On A Friday Afternoon, p. 2).

The Apostle Paul held that this was the *axis mundi*: “When I came to you, brothers, I did not come with eloquence or superior wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony about God. For I resolved to know nothing

while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified.” I Corinthians 2:1-2.

From the New World Encyclopedia: *The axis mundi (also cosmic axis, world axis, world pillar and center of the world) is a symbol representing the center of the world where the heaven (sky) connects with the earth. Different cultures represent the axis mundi by varied symbols.*

Our symbol is the cross. The cross is the crux. The cross is crucial. Quoting Neuhaus again: “...Good Friday is the key to understanding what Dante called ‘the love that moves the sun and all the other stars’.”

During this Lenten season, I have been finding out who I most truly am. I am like the disciples that fell asleep in the Garden of Gethsemane; I am like Judas—too influenced by money and my perspective on how to make things work; I am like the disciples who fled when things became risky; I am like the religious leaders who think they know much more about God than they really do; I am like Peter—proclaiming devotion that I don’t live up to; I am like Pilate—too concerned at times about influential friends and very local politics; I am like_____.

Thank God that He bore my sins on the cross, for He knows me and my need better than I know myself. I need to revisit Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, for then I will know true joy on Easter.
